- School planners – signed homework

 - (skeletal notes, vocabulary)

 - (class pet, homework pass)

Instructional Area: Any

Targeted Skills: Paying attention

Have students stand behind their desks during the lesson. This helps kinesthetic learners as well as your ADHD students.

3.

An alternative assignment was for differentiating assignments for students.

I have used this in my collab math class to help other students and I am beginning to use this with the rest of my classes to complete assignments at their own pace.

4.

1. Preparing the student – Let the student know that next week new unit will be introduced. That way, their anxiety level gets down; learning level gets more receptive (most of my students resist the change).
2. Providing the instruction – Instruction is one to one and in small segments. Usually on that day I will ask other students to practice on what they have already learned while I will sit only with the student who is being introduced to the new unit. This provides security, confidence and taste of success. I will continue overlooking the work and work very closely as I work with other students.
3. Reward – Pat on the back and verbal remarks – (great job, excellent, see how well you do).

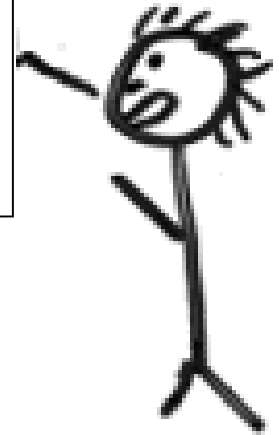

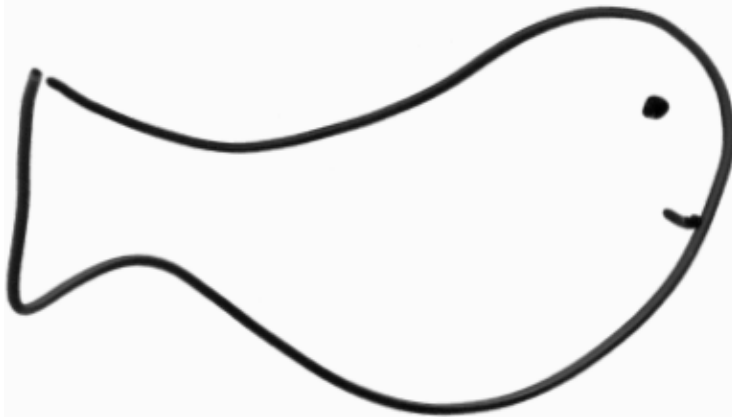
